

VISUPLAIN

0.1 mg/ml eye drops, solution **Bimatoprost**

Read all of this leaflet carefully before you start using this medicine because it contains important information for you.

Keep this leaflet. You may need to read it again.

- If you have further questions, ask your doctor or pharmacist.
- This medicine has been prescribed for you only. Do not pass it on to others. It may harm them, even if their signs of illness are the same as yours.
- If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet. See section 4.

1. What Visuplain is and what it is used for Visuplain is an antiglaucoma preparation. It belongs to a group of medicines called

prostamides.

Visuplain eye drops are used to reduce high pressure in the eye. This medicine may be

used on its own or with other drops called beta-blockers which also reduce pressure. Your eye contains a clear, watery liquid that feeds the inside of the eye. This liquid is

constantly being drained out of the eye and new liquid is made to replace it. If the liquid cannot drain out quickly enough, the pressure inside the eye builds up. This medicine works by increasing the amount of liquid that is drained. This reduces the pressure inside the eye. If high pressure is not reduced, it could lead to a disease called glaucoma and eventually damage your sight.

2. What you need to know before you use Visuplain Do not use Visuplain - if you are allergic to bimatoprost or any of the other ingredients of this medicine (listed

- in section 6).
- if you have had to stop using eye drops in the past because of a side effect of the preservative benzalkonium chloride.

Warnings and precautions: Talk to your doctor or pharmacist before using Visuplain.

Talk to your doctor, if:

you have any breathing problems

- ýou have livér or kidney problems
 you have had a cataract surgery in the past
- you have dry eye
- you have or have had any problems with your cornea (front transparent part of the eye) you wear contact lenses (see "Visuplain contains benzalkonium chloride")
- you have or have had low blood pressure or low heart rate
- you have had a viral infection or inflammation of the eye.

Visuplain may cause your eyelashes to darken and grow and cause the skin around the eyelid to darken too. The colour of your iris may also become darker over time. These changes may be permanent. The change may be more noticeable if you are only treating one eye.

Children and adolescents Visuplain has not been tested in children under the age of 18 and therefore should not

be used by patients under 18 years of age. Other medicines and Visuplain

Pregnancy and breast-feeding If you are pregnant or breast feeding, think you may be pregnant or are planning to have

a baby, ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice before taking any medicine.

Visuplain may get into the breast milk so you should not breast-feed while you are

Your sight may become blurred for a short time just after using Visuplain. You should not drive or use machines until your sight is clear again.

Benzalkonium chloride may be absorbed by soft contact lenses and may change the

Visuplain contains benzalkonium chloride

colour of the contact lenses. You should remove contact lenses before using this medicine and put them back 15 minutes afterwards. Benzalkonium chloride may also cause eye irritation, especially if you have dry eyes or disorders of the cornea (the clear layer at the front of the eye). If you feel an abnormal

eye sensation, stinging or pain in the eye after using this medicine, talk to your doctor.

Visuplain contains phosphates This medicine contains 0.028mg phosphates in each drop, which is equivalent to 0.95 mg/ml.

If you suffer from severe damage to the clear layer at the front of the eye (the cornea), phosphates may cause in very rare cases cloudy patches on the cornea due to calcium

You must not use the bottle if the tamper - evident ring on the bottle neck is broken


If you use Visuplain with another eye medicine, wait at least five minutes between using



To help prevent infections and avoid eye injury, do not let the tip of the bottle touch your eye or anything else. Put the cap back on and close the bottle straight after you have

If you use more Visuplain than you should If you use more Visuplain than you should, it is unlikely to cause you any serious harm. Put your next dose in at the usual time. If you are worried, talk to your doctor or

pharmacist.

Wipe off any excess that runs down the cheek.

If a drop misses your eye, try again.

If you forget to use Visuplain If you forget to use Visuplain, use a single drop as soon as you remember, and then go back to your regular routine. Do not take a double dose to make up for a forgotten dose.

Visuplain should be used every day to work properly. If you stop using Visuplain the pressure inside your eye may go up, therefore talk to your doctor before stopping this treatment.

If you have any further questions on the use of this medicine, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

4. Possible side effects

Like all medicines, this medicine can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

Very common side effects

These may affect more than 1 in 10 people

Affecting the eye

• Slight redness (up to 29 % of people)

Common side effects

- Small breaks in the surface of the eye, with or without inflammation
- Irritation
- Itchy eyes
- Longer eyelashes
- · Irritation, when drop is put in the eye
- Eye pain

Affecting the skin

- Red and itchy eyelids
- · Darker skin colour around the eye · Hair growth around the eye

After first opening of the bottle: You must throw away the bottle 28 days after you first opened it, even if there are still some drops left. This will prevent infections. To help you remember, write down the date you opened it in the space on the box.

What Visuplain contains The active substance is bimatoprost. One ml of solution contains 0.1 mg bimatoprost. - The other ingredients are benzalkonium chloride, disodium hydrogen phosphate heptahydrate, citric acid monohydrate, sodium chloride, hydrochloric acid (for pH

adjustment), sodium hydroxide (for pH adjustment), water for injections.

What Visuplain looks like and contents of the pack Visuplain is a colourless, clear eye drop solution that is free from particles. It is available in a 5 mL white plastic dropper bottle with a white screw cap and a tamper evident ring.

6. Contents of the pack and other information

Each bottle contains 3 mL solution. This is enough for 4 weeks' usage. Visuplain is supplied in a pack containing either 1 plastic bottle or 3 plastic bottles each with a screw cap. Not all pack sizes may be marketed.
